MAYORS REPORT

Mayor Deluca reminded everyone the Kenilworth Farmers Market will be every Tuesday now through mid November, 11AM to 5PM at the Municipal lot across the street from the VFW. We had a little slip up this week....not too sure what happened to the farmer but hopefully he is OK. The UC Board of Chosen Freeholders will be presenting Shakespeare in the Park, free admission at Echo Lake Park, Mountainside on Friday, July 13, 2018 at 7PM. Summer Arts Festival has begun, concerts begin at 7:30 PM on July 18<sup>th</sup> at Echol Lake Park. Five against One which is a Pearl Jam tribute band. On August 1, 2018 in Oak Ridge Park in Clark will be Joe Bonano and the Godsons of Soul and will include a campfire and a hayride dedicated to military personnel. The Kenilworth Fire Department Carnival will be August 13 thru August 18. National Night out for Kenilworth will be August 6<sup>th</sup>, from 6-9PM at Harding School, the actual night for National Night Out is August 7<sup>th</sup>. REPORT OF COMMITTEES

REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF KENILWORTH HELD ON WEDNESDAY EVENING, JULY 11, 2018. MAYOR DELUCA PRESIDED.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT

Councilwoman Karlovitch reported for the second year in a row property tax bills will be issued late due to the lack of a certified rate from the State of New Jersey. Another recent law passed by the State will allow for additional State Aid for public schools however the determination of the amount per district and how the State Aid will be used has not been released. As a result actual property tax bills cannot be mailed and we have not received any information from the State indicating when tax certification is forthcoming. As a result the Tax and Finance Office is preparing to mail estimated 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Property Tax bills for the year 2018. This estimated bill has the same legal status as a regular tax bill. This bill includes taxes that the Borough collects for the Municipality, the local school district, the local public library, the County of Union and the County of Union Open Space Trust. Payment for this bill is due on or before August 1, 2018, with a 10 day grace period ending August 10, 2018. Any payment received after 4:30 PM in the Tax and Finance Office on August 10, 2018 will accrue interest charges retroactive to the August 1, 2018 due date. Payments can be made by the following ways, in person Monday thru Friday 8:30Am to 4:30PM, on line at [www.kenilworthborough.com](http://www.kenilworthborough.com) , you can click your view and pay your taxes or the Borough Tax and Finance Office drop box assessable 24 hours, 7 days a week, located on the Tax and Finance Office door, at Borough Hall on the bottom floor. Payments are processed based on the date we physically receive the payment and not the postmark, please allow enough time if you are mailing your payment or using your personal banks on-line bill paying feature. Payments made using your banks on-line bill paying system are mailed to us and they take up to 7 days to reach us. Also the Senior Citizen Handyman Program still has funds available for qualified Senior Citizens to do light handyman work around their homes. Senior Citizens will pay only the cost of the materials and rental of equipment if needed. There is no charge for the labor involved. Any senior citizen who is interested can fill out an application in the Tax Office, the Senior Citizen Center, the Library or the Clerk's Office.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

Councilman David had nothing to report.

Councilman Clementi was absent. Mayor Deluca reminded everyone that National Night Out is August 6, 2018.

DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING, ZONING & ORDINANCES

Councilman Schielke reported the Planning Board will meet tomorrow night and there are 2 cases that will be heard. He received and reviewed the Planning, Zoning and Construction report for June, 2018. Working with the Borough Clerk he assisted a resident obtaining the services of the Handyman Program. He had a meeting with a business owner in regards to fees charged by our Planning and Engineering officials when he came before the Board, he had some questions and that meeting had a very positive resolution. Last week he went to the farmers market and thoroughly enjoyed that. Previously he had mentioned a zoning amendment to make Kenilworth more business friendly for small businesses and he will be taking that up tomorrow night at the planning board and we should have a resolution for the next council meeting.

**WHEREAS**, the facts which led this Governing Body to impose such special conditions have continued;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Governing Body of the Borough of Kenilworth that Plenary Retail Consumption License No. 2008-33-006-008 of BLACK OPS, LLC, Inc. t/a Blackthorn, be renewed for a one year period commencing July 1, 2018, subject however to the following conditions on the licensed premises:

1. Occupancy on the deck area shall not exceed 145 persons.
2. No portable service bar is permitted.
3. The deck area must be closed to patrons by 1 A.M., at which time the consumption of alcohol on the deck area shall be prohibited.
4. No music or other form of entertainment may be played, broadcast or conducted on or over the deck area after 12:00 A.M.; all outdoor speakers shall face toward the licensed premise and outdoor sound barrier panels/curtains must be utilized.
5. Volume for any external audio equipment shall not unreasonably interfere with the quiet and peaceful enjoyment of the neighboring properties.
6. Any alteration to the facility where patrons consume alcoholic beverages shall require Kenilworth A.B.C. Board consent.
7. The licensee on Thursday through Saturday nights, or any other night as deemed necessary by the Chief of Police or his designee, from 8PM to closing shall employ a designated individual to maintain a peaceful and orderly facility.
8. The licensee must notify the Borough of Kenilworth of any "special" events, at least fifteen (15) days in advance.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that if any of the special conditions is determined to be unenforceable or improper, the remaining special conditions shall remain in effect.

RESOLUTION NO. 12

**WHEREAS**, H-GAC is a regional planning commission and political subdivision of the State of Texas operating under Chapter 391, Texas Local Government Code; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Act, H-GAC is authorized to contract with eligible entities to perform governmental functions and services, including the purchase of goods and services; and

**WHEREAS**, in reliance on such authority, H-GAC has instituted a cooperative purchasing program under which it contracts with eligible entities under the Act; and

**WHEREAS**, End User has represented that it is an eligible entity under the Act, that its governing body has authorized this Contract on **07/11/2018** (Date), and that it desires to contract with H-GAC on the terms set forth below;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, H-GAC and the End User do hereby agree as follows:

**Article 1: Legal Authority**

The End User represents and warrants to H-GAC that (1) it is eligible to contract with H-GAC under the Act because it is one of the following: a local government, as defined in the Act (a county, a municipality, a special district, or other political subdivision of the State of Texas or any other state), or a combination of two or more of those entities, a state agency (an agency of the State of Texas as defined in Section 771.002 of the Texas Government Code, or a similar agency of another state), or a non-profit corporation created and operated to provide one or more governmental functions and services, and (2) it possesses adequate legal authority to enter into this Contract.

**Article 2: Applicable Laws**

H-GAC and the End User agree to conduct all activities under this Contract in accordance with all applicable rules, regulations, and ordinances and laws in effect or promulgated during the term of this Contract.

**Article 3: Whole Agreement**

This Contract and any attachments, as provided herein, constitute the complete contract between the parties hereto, and supersede any and all oral and written agreements between the parties relating to matters herein.

**Article 4: Performance Period**

The period of this Contract shall be for the balance of the fiscal year of the End User, which began **01/01/2018** and ends **12/31/2018**. This Contract shall thereafter automatically be renewed annually for each succeeding fiscal year, provided that such renewal shall not have the effect of extending the period in which the End User may make any payment due an H- GAC contractor beyond the fiscal year in which such obligation was incurred under this Contract.

**Article 5: Scope of Services**

The End User appoints H-GAC its true and lawful purchasing agent for the purchase of certain products and services through the H- GAC Cooperative Purchasing Program. End User will access the Program through HGACBuy.com and by submission of any duly executed purchase order, in the form prescribed by H-GAC to a contractor having a valid contract with H-GAC. All purchases hereunder shall be in accordance with specifications and contract terms and pricing established by H-GAC. Ownership (title) to products purchased through H-GAC shall transfer directly from the contractor to the End User.

**Article 6: Payments**

H-GAC will confirm each order and issue notice to contractor to proceed. Upon delivery of goods or services purchased, and presentation of a properly documented invoice, the End User shall promptly, and in any case within thirty (30) days, pay H-GAC's contractor the full amount of the invoice. All payments for goods or services will be made from current revenues available to the paying party. In no event shall H-GAC have any financial liability to the End User for any goods or services End User procures from an H-GAC contractor.

**Article 7: Changes and Amendments**

This Contract may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties, except that any alterations, additions, or deletions to the terms of this Contract which are required by changes in Federal and State law or regulations are automatically incorporated into this Contract without written amendment hereto and shall become effective on the date designated by such law or regulation.

H-GAC reserves the right to make changes in the scope of products and services offered through the H-GAC Cooperative Purchasing Program to be performed hereunder.

**Article 8: Termination Procedures**

H-GAC or the End User may cancel this Contract at any time upon thirty (30) days written notice by certified mail to the other party to this Contract. The obligations of the End User, including its obligation to pay H-GAC's contractor for all costs incurred under this Contract prior to such notice shall survive such cancellation, as well as any other obligation incurred under this Contract, until performed or discharged by the End User.

**Article 9: Severability**

All parties agree that should any provision of this Contract be determined to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect any other term of this Contract, which shall continue in full force and effect.

**Article 10: Force Majeure**

To the extent that either party to this Contract shall be wholly or partially prevented from the performance within the term specified of any obligation or duty placed on such party by reason of or through strikes, stoppage of labor, riot, fire, flood, acts of war, insurrection, accident, order of any court, act of God, or specific cause reasonably beyond the party's control and not attributable to its neglect or nonfeasance, in such event, the time for the performance of such obligation or duty shall be suspended until such disability to perform is removed; provided, however, force majeure shall not excuse an obligation solely to pay funds. Determination of force majeure shall rest solely with H-GAC.

**Article 11: Venue**

Disputes between procuring party and Vendor are to be resolved in accord with the law and venue rules of the State of purchase.
