Mayor Deluca said the Council has discussed the Council Presidency vacancy and determined that Larry Clementi be appointed Council President for the year 2017.

Mayor Deluca congratulated Larry. Councilman Clementi thanked everyone for giving him the opportunity to serve as Council President and he will do his best to uphold that position.

**REPORT OF COMMITTEES**

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FINANCE DEPARTMENT

Councilwoman Karlovitch had nothing to report.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

Councilman David said the Shade Tree Account for the Borough is dwindling fast so tree work will be put on hold for any non-emergency trees that need to be taken care of, only emergencies right now will be dealt with as far as tree removals or trimming. Superintendent Ryan said he is getting a lot of complaints from residents about the paving stones in the center of sidewalks lifting up and decaying, also the sidewalks down by DiMario Park and under the overpass bridge are coming apart, he advised everyone to be careful when you are walking. We received communication from Giordano our recycling company and they are looking to start next year with doing two days per month for recyclables, they are going to do the whole town in 1 day. He said that is their proposal and we are going to look into that and if we decide to do that it will save us a little bit of money on the end of the contract. The two days are Mondays and Thursdays which we will discuss what we are going to do, whether it coincides with other pick-ups we have going on. He said it will definitely benefit the Borough by getting it done in one day.

The Mayor said we will do a timely shout out to everyone to let them know what is happening. There may be some changes with the sweeper schedule or the grass pick-up schedule and our garbage pick-up, we would like everything to work in accordance with each other so that the street sweeper is not going up the street when there are garbage cans out there.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Councilman Corvelli thanked the Police Department for a job well done at the Carnival last week, there were no major problems. Tonight we discussed a contract for an employee in the Police Department and that is not finalized and he will get back to everyone on that.

DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING, ZONING & ORDINANCES

Councilman Clementi said he is in receipt of the July Monthly Zoning Report from Robert Herbert. Some of the highlights are that he completed inspections, met with the public, issued non-compliance letters, various summonses were issued, zoning reviews and he attended meetings and court sessions. He sent 20 violation notices sent, 27 zoning permits received, 6 summonses issued and 13 complaints received. The next Planning Board Meeting will be September 14<sup>th</sup> at 7PM.

DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION AND FIRE

Councilwoman Ceceri reported that for Recreation soccer will start in the beginning of October. Coach applications are in and background checks are being made. She said school starts September 7<sup>th</sup> and when the fields and gym are available they will be posted on the web site. The Carnival went well and she thanked St. Theresa's, the Police Department, the DPW and all the organizations that volunteered their time. She said it was a very good turnout.

The Mayor said the winner of the Super 50/50 took home close to \$10,000.

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DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, EDUCATION & HUMAN SERVICES

Councilman Ladauti reported schools start the first week of September. He said he would like to invite the Superintendent to come to the Work Shop and explain the grades that the students are getting on the State tests. The Library had a nice summer and did many things for the kids like reading programs, playtime and they did experiments at Rutgers. The Health Department is working on the Health Fair on September 23, 2017.

RESOLUTION NO. 12

**A RESOLUTION TO PERMIT COMCAST CABLE TO REMOVE THEIR EXISTING POLE(S) AND CONDUIT FROM DI MARIO PARK AND INSTALL UNDERGROUND CONDUIT ALONG THE NORTHERN PERIMETER FROM SOUTH MICHIGAN AVENUE TO MARKET STREET**

**PURPOSE:** To permit Comcast to place an underground conduit adjacent to the Borough's northern property line in Di Mario Park from South Michigan Avenue to Market Street and remove their existing poles and conduit adjacent to the tennis courts.

**WHEREAS,** in October 1994 the Borough permitted Suburban Cablevision to place a pole in Di Mario Park in order to remove an obstruction from the adjacent property that interfered with the driveway; and

**WHEREAS,** the existing conduit in Di Mario Park is adjacent to the tennis courts and may interfere with construction and further development of the park.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Kenilworth, County of Union, State of New Jersey. Face amount of the check, attorney fees, court costs, costs of mailing a demand for payment, and damages in an amount equal to \$100.00 or triple the amount of the check, whichever is greater, but not to exceed \$500.00. The Borough of Kenilworth on this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of August, 2017 directs as follows:

Comcast Cable shall be permitted to install a conduit in Di Mario Park along the north perimeter for the use of fiber optics and or cable communications provided

- a. All work shall be coordinated by the Borough Engineer;
- b. The existing poles for the aerial cable shall be removed; and
- c. The existing conduit adjacent to tennis courts shall be either removed or otherwise decommissioned;
- d. All work required to implement the foregoing shall be completed by October 30, 2017.

3. The deck area must be closed to patrons by 12:30 A.M., except on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings when said closing shall be at 1:00 A.M., at which time the consumption of alcohol on the deck area shall be prohibited.
4. No music or other form of entertainment may be played, broadcast or conducted on or over the deck area after 12:00 A.M.; all outdoor speakers shall face toward the licensed premise.
5. Volume for any external audio equipment shall not unreasonably interfere with the quiet and peaceful enjoyment of the neighboring properties.
6. Operating months for the deck area shall be from April 15<sup>th</sup> through October 15<sup>th</sup>.
7. Deck area allowed to be open March 17<sup>th</sup> (St. Patrick's Day).
8. Any alteration to the facility where patrons consume alcoholic beverages shall require Kenilworth A.B.C. Board consent.
9. The licensee on Thursday through Saturday nights from 8PM to closing shall employ a designated individual to maintain a peaceful and orderly facility.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that if any of the special conditions is determined to be unenforceable or improper, the remaining special conditions shall remain in effect.

Motion was made by Councilman Ladauti, seconded by Councilman David to close the meeting to the public. All in favor.
