FINANCE DEPARTMENT

Councilman David report that as always, the City of Rahway Sanitation Department did an excellent job with curbside bulky waste collection. All of the leaf machines have been serviced and are ready to go, for the start of curbside leaf season, at the beginning of November. Dave Vanik, 642 Fairfield Ave. – Mr. Vanik wanted to make it part of the record that on Monday, October 23rd he met with Mayor Deluca to discuss 5 issues that he and his neighbors have with Gavelstone Bar and Grill and their patrons. These issues are parking, noise, illegal activities in vehicles, litter and safety concerns. He thanked the Mayor for meeting with him and hopefully we can make some progress in resolving these situations, because they definitely affect our neighborhood.

Mayor Deluca thanked him for his time.

REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF KENILWORTH HELD ON WEDNESDAY EVENING, OCTOBER 25, 2017. MAYOR ANTHONY DELUCA PRESIDED.

Rich Price, 290 South Michigan – Mr. Price said he wanted to go on the record saying he met with the Mayor on Monday, October 23rd to discuss 5 issues that he and his neighbors have with Gavelstone Bar and Grill and their patrons. These issues are parking, noise, illegal activities in vehicles, litter and safety concerns. He thanked the Mayor for meeting with him.

The Mayor thanked the residents for coming forward and said we have a problem and we know there are solutions and we are going to get them. He said he and the Chief are working on solutions to these problems as we speak.

Councilman Corvelli stated he met with the owner of the Gavelstone last night and she is very committed to working these problems out. He assured her that we are going to every business we have down there for the parking problem. She has hired 3 more employees to help clean-up after the bar is closed and that should alleviate some of the problem. The Chief is here and if you see anything going on in a car or think you see something in a car, call the police, don't take the action in your own hands. He is not a proponent of taking pictures or videos, call the police and they will address the problem. He met with her for ½ hour last night and through the Mayor we will have another meeting and everybody will be involved. He did not go to the meeting the other day, apologized, he was at another meeting but like the Mayor said...cool heads prevail and we will solve this problem and your quality of life will not be interrupted.

Chief Zimmerman said if you see something...the make model of a car if you think something is going on inside the car, call the police. He said 99% of the time we will be there immediately unless there is an emergency.

Resident from 287 South Michigan Avenue – He said his concern is noise outside after the bar is closed. The bar they can control but there are people who stand there for ½ hr. in front of his house yelling and screaming. He has 2 young children 6 yr. old and 4 yr. old who get woken up in the middle of the night. He almost got into a fist fight in front of his house. That is his problem and the bar cannot control that.

Councilman Corvelli said, as Councilman David would attest to, he did it for 25 years, I did it in Hillside, he said his boss would tell him, after the bar lets out, ½ hr. before the bar lets out go over there. They didn't want to bother people but when they bother people, we bother them....get in your car or get a ride home. He said if you hear something or see something call. The Chief has road patrols out there. The resident said sometimes he calls and by the time the police get there they are gone. His request is for more patrols when they close the bar.

Mary Michitsch, Monmouth Ave. - Mrs. Michitsch said that on November 18th Social Concerns will be giving baskets out to anyone who needs one for Thanksgiving. The baskets contain, a turkey and \$10.00. She said they should call the church and give your first name, they do not ask for identification. They are happy to help anyone who is in need and she knows there are a lot of people that need help out there. They average 250 baskets every year and soon after that they will be doing the Christmas tree.

The Borough Clerk, Laura Reinertsen said the staff at Borough Hall have decided to do a reverse advent project and it's pretty much just the employees here at Borough Hall and a few of the officials collecting, not just food and grocery items but gift cards and some small items for children. We hope to have a drop off to you right before Thanksgiving. Mrs. Michitsch asked Laura to give her a call to make sure she is at the Rectory.

REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF KENILWORTH HELD ON WEDNESDAY EVENING, OCTOBER 25, 2017. MAYOR ANTHONY DELUCA PRESIDED.

Ricardo Chinchilla, 675 Fairfield Avenue – Mr. Chinchilla said he moved here a few years ago because he thinks it is a very nice town but with this situation it is bad. He has two little kids, 10 and 7 and they have stolen their bikes from the driveway. Mr. Chinchilla gave the Mayor pictures of the garbage they left. He said every neighbor will be happy to see the police driving by while the bar is open.

Tony, 240 Washington Ave. – He said there are trucks parked over his fence at 185 8th Street and he would like them to put a fence where he cannot see or smell the trucks. Mayor Deluca said the Zoning Officer is here and he can answer your question.

Bob Herbert, Zoning Officer – Mr. Herbert said that is an Industrial/Commercial zone. He said trucks come in and out along the rear property line near residential. Mr. Tony is asking when they were approved why didn't the Board make them put the gate on the other side of the property. He said he is only part time and it is on his list to pull out the resolution and look at it and when he gets a chance he will meet with the property owner and if it is in the resolution he will make sure they correct it and if it is not in the resolution he will ask the property owner to reconsider to relocate the fence for the residential residents.

Councilwoman Ceceri said she has had experience with idling trucks, the ordinance said that trucks cannot idle between 9 at night and 7AM, there is a noise ordinance for commercial trucks. She said he should call the police as soon as he hears it. She said if he needs the ordinance, she has a copy at her home.

Mr. Tony said the town should not let them park their trucks near the fence.

Councilman David said you cannot force the owner to do that because that is his property and it is zoned Industrial/Commercial.

Mr. Tony said he would not have bought his house if he knew there would be trucks there.

Motion was made by Councilman David, seconded by Councilman Ladauti to close the meeting to the public. All in favor.
